Scholarships and Bursaries 2017 – How to Apply

Bursaries

Bursaries are awarded depending upon the financial circumstances of the student. Students wishing to be considered for bursary assistance need to write a letter to the Provost detailing the reasons for their application. In this letter it is important that they address the following matters:

- The financial circumstances of their family.
- Details of *CentreLink* payments they are, or will, receive.
- Any other scholarships or bursaries they receive.
- Other anticipated income for 2017.
- Details of the number of dependent siblings in their family.
- Any other matters that are deemed relevant.

Following receipt of your letter, your application for a bursary will be discussed with you at your interview with the College. Bursaries range from \$1,000 to \$10,000 and are paid via a remission in fees.

Scholarships

Students **do not** apply for a scholarship. These are awarded upon your academic results.

- For first year undergraduates, these are based upon ATAR or equivalent scores. In 2016, students with an ATAR of over 99 were awarded a scholarship.
- In addition, students who were the Dux in Year 12 in a Catholic school are eligible for a scholarship.
- For returning undergraduates, a university H1 average normally qualifies for a scholarship
- Scholarships are renewable each year depending upon results.
- All graduate students qualify for a minimum scholarship (normally a Rector's Exhibition) of \$3,000 p.a.
- Scholarships range from \$1,000 - \$10,000 p.a. and are awarded via a remission in fees.

Please Note:

- In 2016, over 190 students received some sort of bursary and/or scholarship support.
- It is possible to hold a bursary and scholarship at the same time.
- The majority of bursary support in the College is directed towards students from country regions of Australia.
